### FIFTH ORDER OF BUSINESS

### **401(A) Committee Meeting Update**

### Consideration of Related Matters

Ms. Sanchez referred to a handout of an evaluation rubric and read the following email from Mr. Brad Larsen, of NFP, into the record:

"During the Committee Meeting, we reviewed a Provider Comparison Report and pricing guide from three proposed recordkeepers; Empower, Lincoln and Voya, and the incumbent Mission Square. All three proposed recordkeepers provided an upgrade in the following areas: background and experience, recordkeeping, participant services, investment platform, compliance, fixed account options and pricing. The committee agreed that it makes sense to change to one of the proposed recordkeepers and asked that NFP provide a comparison grid to summarize and prioritize our options. With investment platform, fixed account options and pricing being the biggest differentiators, NFP then provided a decision rubric that scored the proposed recordkeepers in the following rank: #1, Lincoln, #2, Empower, #3, Voya. Assuming the Board approves the decision to move or transfer the plan to Lincoln, we can begin the conversion process that will take between 60 to 90 days to finalize."

Mr. Ortiz stated the rubric is very well done, and voiced his opinion that the decision to have NFP proceed with the transfer is easy. Mr. Morera concurred.

On MOTION by Mr. Morera and seconded by Mr. Ortiz, with all in favor, transferring the 401(A) Plan from the current recordkeeper, Mission Square, to Lincoln, was approved.

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Mr. Ortiz wished everyone a Happy New Year and an enjoyable long weekend to those who have the upcoming Martin Luther King holiday off.

Mr. Morera welcomed everyone back from the holidays and reported that he recently attended a City Commission workshop wherein the Coral Springs Improvement District (CSID) Officials made a presentation regarding a Stormwater Management and Resiliency program that they are about to commence, which is quite similar to the Canal Z/West Outfall Canal (WOFC) project that SWCD undertook and completed. He was pleasantly surprised to learn that SWCD's modeling was used as a base for CSID's presentation to the Commission and thanked

City Staff for the acknowledgement. Mr. Morera wished the CSID good luck and stated he and Mr. Selchan will monitor the project's development and progression.

Discussion ensued regarding the City Commission meeting, CSID's presentation, the ambitiousness of the CSID project compared to the SWCD's WOFC project, a video from the South Florida Water Management District (SFWMD), funding and the fact that there will be no impact on assessments.

Craig A. Smith & Associates, Inc. (CAS) is pleased to provide you with the MER summarizing activity performed by our team on behalf of SWCD during the referenced period including future work. Anything of significance or modifications occurring after this writing will be brought up at the February 8, 2023 BOS meeting.

### **Electrical Repairs at Pump Station Nos. 1 and 2**

Current Connections Inc continues to work on the building permit for the foundation work at PS2. Storage tank approvals have been obtained from Broward County.

### West Outfall Canal Phase 2B Improvements & Work at PS1

CAS, SWCD, and Rio-Bak Corporation had a field meeting to discuss the proposed PS1-work entailing the intake bay and canal work upstream of the station with Fabriform revetment system between the current pump station and location of the old pump station to be installed at canal bottom. CAS has requested a price proposal from RBC to perform the necessary construction for these items. Note that RBC is currently under contract with the SWCD to perform canal related work.

- A proposal from RBC to perform this work as a project change order to the current contract will be provided at the board meeting. It is the intent of the work (dewatering) at PS1 by RBC to be coordinated with the electrical work being performed by CCI. The canal dewatering by RBC is intended to serve two functions; allow CCI access under the station and allow RBC to perform the canal work at this location.
- Attached is a recommended proposal from Radise International for their structural engineering services during construction for a lump fee of \$5,436.00 and includes inspection reports, responses to contractor RFI's, and construction certification. The previous work authorization only included design services.
- Riverside Dr Bridge to be discussed at the meeting.

### **Right-of-Way Permitting**

SWCD has received a license request from FDOT regarding the proposed highway improvements along Sample Rd near Riverside Dr and Woodside Dr. The license will allow for the enhancement and betterment of the property to create a more aesthetically pleasing finished road corridor. CAS recommends executing the license document. Attached is the license request to allow FDOT to complete the improvement at the property and the plans that reflect the actual locations of the proposed work.

The following applications are under review as noted:

- Amera Downtown Development Co., LLC Sample Road and University Drive: Response to the comments made have not been submitted. Applicant is still working on the compensating storage issues and the legal instrument regarding the existing SWCD canal.
- Foundry Industrial Trailer Parking & Storage (Wiles Road and Sawgrass Expressway): Application submittal has been received and has been reviewed with comments sent to the applicant's engineer.
- FDOT University Dr road widening for 1.5 miles north NW 40<sup>th</sup> St: Application has been received and is under review. We is recognized that the project is currently under construction and that a permit application submittal was inadvertently overlooked by the FDOT consultant and where FDOT is now looking to address the required permitting.

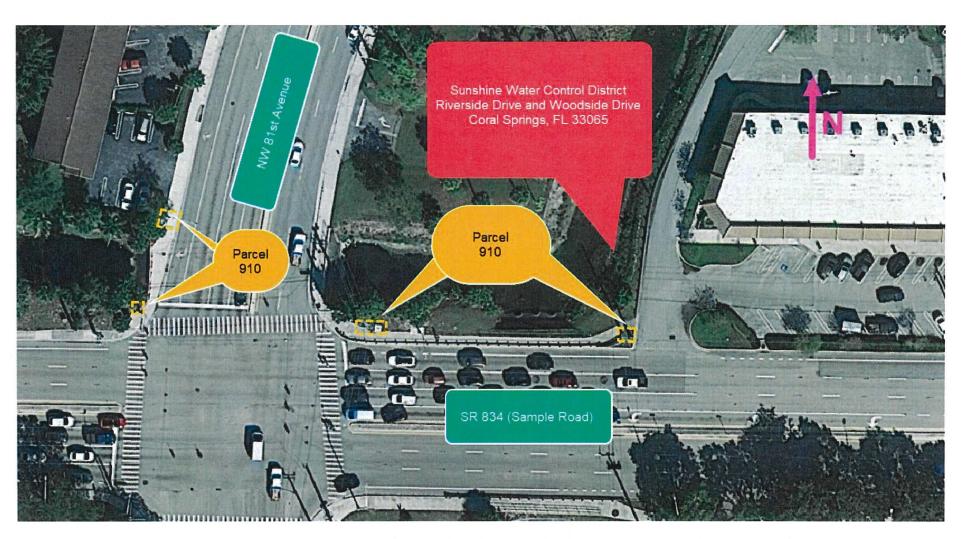

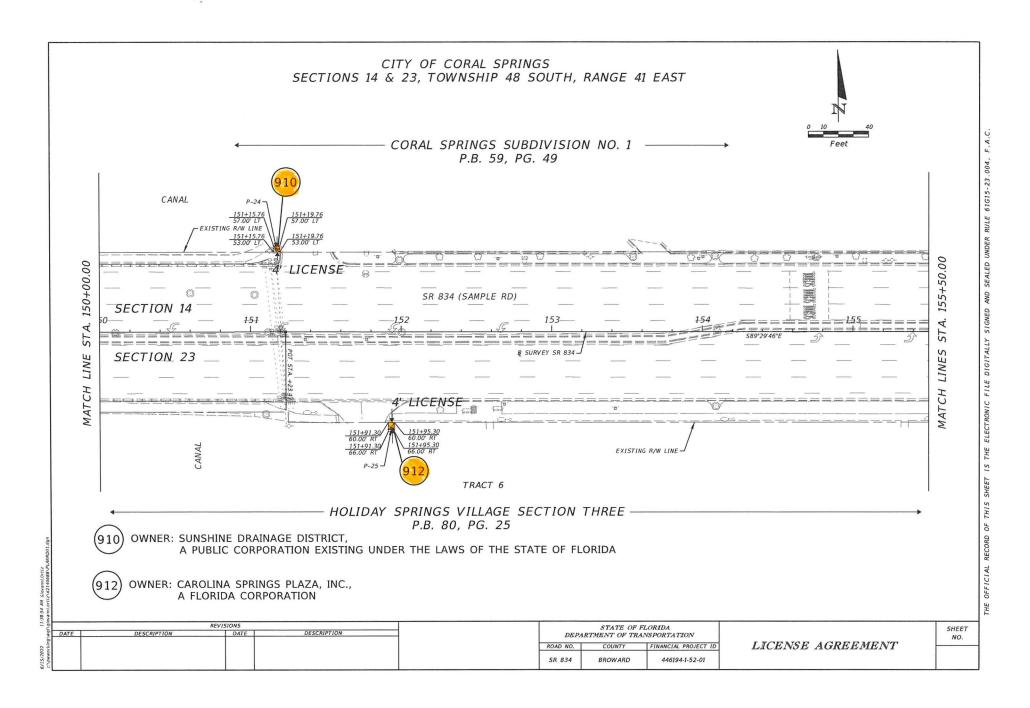

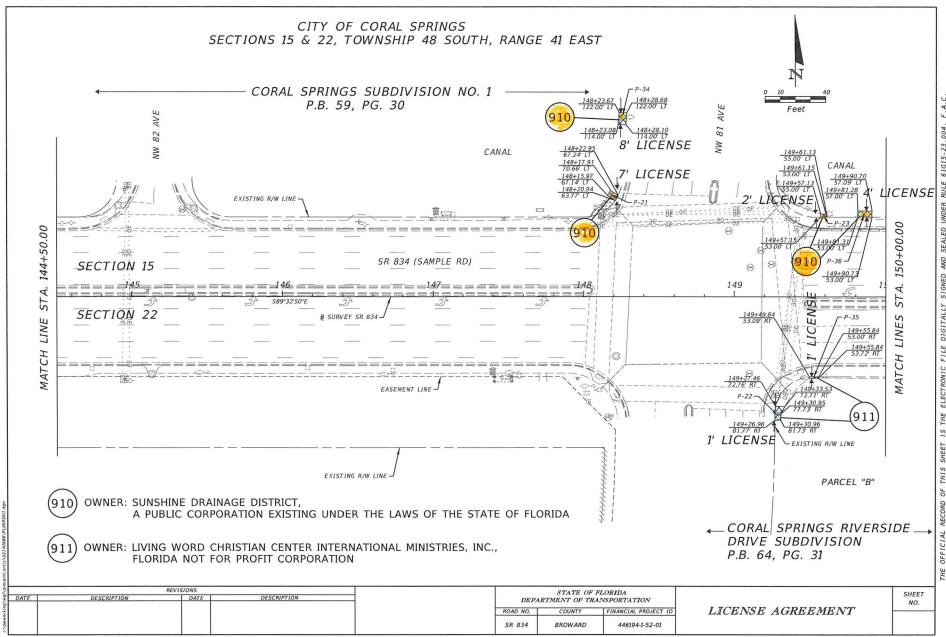
